

How to create multiple strokes in your art

- Select the type tool
- Select the font, size, leading, color etc.
- Type your message in the document.
- Select the create warp text if desired.
- Go to the Styles panel, found in the bottom right corner of the window.
- Make sure your type layer is selected, then click or double click on a layer style you like.
(optional)
- If the layer style you choose has a drop shadow, the strokes will go around the drop shadow too, making the stroke appear uneven. If that is the look you want leave it. If you don't want the stroke to appear uneven, go to layer-layer styles, and unclick the stroke check box to remove the stroke from that style.
- Select your type layer, then select the group icon at the top of the layers panel. (By adding all the strokes to groups instead of the individual layer you will be able to drag other layers into your groups and all the strokes will be applied).
- Click on the small arrow at the left side of the group to make sure your type layer is in the group. If not, drag it into the group.
- Select the group by clicking on it.
- Go to Layer – Layer Style – Style Settings
- Click on Stroke.
- Select a color and size for the stroke and click OK. The stroke is now around your type.
- Click on the icon at the top of the layers panel to create a new group.
- Drag your first group into the new group.
- Click on the small arrow at the left side of the group to make sure your first group is inside the new group. If not, drag it into the group. You should now have your type layer in a group which is nested within another group.
- Select the new group by clicking on it
- Go to Layer – Layer Style – Style Settings
- Click on Stroke.
- Select a color and size for the stroke and click OK. The second stroke is now around your first

stroke.

- Repeat the process as many times as needed to create as many strokes as you would like.
- If you need to move your type, drag it out of the group, move it to the desired location, then move it back into the group.
- You can add multiple strokes around photographs too, just use the same procedure of dragging the layer into multiple groups nested within each other, each group having a stroke.
- Name your groups if needed to keep them organized.
- Add a shadow layer style if desired to your last stroke.
